

PRIMARY GIRLS – FORMAL UNIFORM

Item	Description	How to be worn
Dress	College issue tartan dress	To be worn between the bottom of kneecap and mid-calf. Please leave a generous hem.
Hat	College issue Primary hat	To be worn during outdoor play and outdoor classes.
Socks	College issue girls' socks	To be worn so that navy stripe is visible. Please buy big enough so as not to look like ankle socks.
Shoes	Black lace-up leather school shoes of plain, conventional design (maximum 2 cm heel) and black laces. No leather sports shoes or buckles. Prep to Year 2 may use velcro straps instead of laces.	Laces are to be tied firmly with a bow at the top. The backs must always be firm to support the heel. Shoes must be in good condition and polished regularly.
Jumper	College issue navy jumper	Sleeves not to be worn pushed/rolled up or pulled down over the hands.
Stockings (optional)	College issue black stockings	To always be in good condition. Optional in Terms 2 and 3.
Scarf (optional)	College issue scarf	Scarves and gloves are available from the Uniform Shop and are optional in Terms 2 and 3 only. Gloves are only to be worn with the jumper. <u>No fingerless gloves.</u>
Gloves (optional)	College issue ink blue woollen gloves	
Hair Accessories (optional)	Plain navy, black or neutral hair ties with optional navy ribbon or white ribbon	Hair accessories are available from the Uniform Shop. Girls' hair is to be a natural colour . Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be worn fully tied back with appropriate ties and the fringe worn clear of eyes. The hairstyle is to allow the hat to be worn properly.

PRIMARY BOYS – FORMAL UNIFORM

Item	Description	How to be worn
Shirt	College issue blue short-sleeved shirt	To be worn out (not tucked into the shorts) and the collar turned down. Sleeves are not to be rolled up.
Shorts	College issue shorts	Shorts are to be worn firmly on the waist, and to the top of the knee.
Hat	College issue Primary hat	To be worn during outdoor play and outdoor classes. Boys' hair is to be conservatively cut, worn clear of the eyes, and off the collar. It is to be a natural colour. Tails, braiding and extreme haircuts (e.g. tracks) are not permitted. Hair is not to be tied up.
Socks	College issue Primary boys' socks	Do not fold over.
Shoes	Black lace-up leather school shoes of plain, conventional design (maximum 2 cm heel) and black laces. No leather sports shoes. Prep to Year 2 may use velcro straps instead of laces.	Laces are to be tied firmly with a bow at the top. The backs must always be firm to support the heel. Shoes must be in good condition and polished regularly.
Jumper	College issue navy jumper	Sleeves not to be worn pushed/rolled up or pulled down over the hands.
Belt (optional)	Black dress leather belt with simple silver buckle	Only applies to Primary boys who need to wear Secondary sized shorts or trousers that require a belt. Available from the Uniform Shop.
Trousers (optional)	College issue trousers	Trousers are to be worn firmly on the waist, and to the top of the heel.
Scarf (optional)	College issue scarf	Scarves and gloves are available from the Uniform Shop and are optional in Terms 2 and 3 only. Gloves are only to be worn with the jumper. No fingerless gloves.
Gloves (optional)	College issue ink blue woollen gloves	

SECONDARY GIRLS - FORMAL UNIFORM

Item	Description	How to be worn
Blouse	College issue blouse	To be worn modestly with all buttons done up.
Skirt	College issue tartan pleated skirt	To be worn firmly on the waist with the length of skirt to be between the bottom of kneecap and mid-calf. Please leave a generous hem. Adjust waist by tightening buttons at back.
Hat	College issue Secondary hat	To be worn at all times when in uniform except when inside.
Tie	Years 7 - 9 - short College issue tie Years 10 - 12 - long College issue tie	Ties are to be worn neatly, with the collar turned over. If jumper is worn, tie is to be tucked inside the jumper.
Socks	College issue girls' socks	To be worn so that the navy stripe is visible. Please buy big enough so as not to look like anklet socks.
Shoes	Black lace-up leather school shoes of plain, conventional design (maximum 2 cm heel) and black laces. No leather sports shoes or buckles.	Laces are to be tied firmly with a bow at the top. The backs must always be firm to support the heel. Shoes are to be in good condition and polished regularly.
Jumper	College issue navy jumper	Sleeves not to be worn pushed/rolled up or pulled down over the hands. If worn, jumper is to be worn completely - not as a scarf or arm warmers or tied around the waist.
Stockings (optional)	College issue black stockings	To always be in good condition (no noticeable holes).
Scarf (optional)	College issue navy scarf	Scarves and gloves are available from the Uniform Shop and are optional in Terms 2 and 3 only and are to be worn with the jumper. No fingerless gloves.
Gloves (optional)	College issue ink blue woollen gloves	
Hair Accessories (if required)	Plain navy, black or neutral hair ties with optional navy, black or white plain ribbon	Hair that is longer than collar length is to be fully tied back with the fringe free of the eyes in a style that is conducive to wearing the formal and sports hat. Hair accessories are available from the Uniform Shop.

SECONDARY BOYS – FORMAL UNIFORM

Item	Description	How to be worn
Shirt	Years 7 - 9 College issue blue boys' shirt Years 10 - 12 College issue white boys' shirt	Shirts must be worn tucked in neatly and the collar must be turned down. Sleeves are not to be rolled up.
Shorts	Years 7 - 9 College issue boys' shorts Years 10 - 12 College issue boys' shorts	Shorts are to be worn firmly on the waist, and to the top of the knee.
Belt	Black leather dress belt with simple silver buckle	Available from the Uniform Shop.
Hat	College issue secondary hat	To be worn at all times when in uniform except when inside.
Socks	College issue Secondary boys' long socks to be worn with the shorts. Short grey College issue socks may be worn with the trousers.	Long socks are to be worn pulled up and neatly folded over once only.
Shoes	Black lace-up leather school shoes of plain, conventional design and black laces. No leather sports shoes.	Laces are to be tied firmly with a bow at the top. Shoes must be in good condition and polished regularly.
Jumper	College issue navy jumper	Sleeves not to be worn pushed/rolled up or pulled down over the hands. If worn, jumper is to be worn completely - not as a scarf or arm warmers or tied around the waist.
Tie	College issue tie	To be worn for designated events. Optionally worn at school at other times. If worn, the top button of the shirt must be done up with the tie knot sitting neatly on the button.
Trousers (optional)	Years 7 - 12 College issue trousers are optionally worn at any time throughout the year.	Trousers are to be worn firmly on the waist, and to the top of the heel.
Scarf (optional)	College issue navy scarf	Scarves and Gloves are available from the Uniform Shop and are optional during winter in Terms 2 and 3 only and are to be worn with the jumper. No fingerless gloves.
Gloves (optional)	College issues ink blue woollen gloves	

BAC SPORTS UNIFORM (BOYS and GIRLS)

Item	Description	How to be worn
Shirt	College issue sport polo shirt	Sport polo shirt is designed not to be tucked in and is to be worn with the top button undone.
Shorts	College issue sport shorts	To be worn at a length that finishes at the top of the knee.
Hat/Cap	Primary – College issue bucket hat Secondary - College issue cap or bucket hat	To be worn at all times when in uniform except when inside. If students are participating in rigorous sport that prohibits the wearing of the cap, 30+ Sunscreen is to be generously applied to the face, ears and neck.
Socks	College issue sport socks	Students may not wear stockings or tights under their sport shorts.
Sports Shoes	Predominantly plain sports/jogger shoes with non-marking sole. Canvas, volleys, skate shoes, slip-on or high-top shoes are not appropriate. Specialist shoes for specific sports (e.g. soccer or basketball boots) can be worn at the time of participating in those sports.	Laces to be tied tightly with a bow at the top. Shoes to be clean and in good condition.
Sport Jacket	College issue tracksuit jacket. Tracksuit jacket is highly recommended in Terms 2 and 3. Non-regulation jackets and hoodies are not permitted.	Can be worn all year as required with the sport uniform.
Sport Track Pants/Trousers (optional)	College issue sport track pants	
Sport team uniforms and tops	College issue uniforms/attire specific to particular sports	Team uniforms and tops must not be worn as part of the sport or formal uniform, and may only be used for their intended sport.

OTHER UNIFORM ITEMS AND REQUIREMENTS

Bags	College issue formal school bag and sports bag are to be used by all students. The music bag is to be used if a student is studying an instrument or is involved in ensembles while at BAC. The formal school bag is to be kept in lockers on secondary throughout the day.
Hair	Girls – Girls' hair is to be a natural colour . Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be worn fully tied back with appropriate ties (as listed in uniform description) and the fringe worn clear of eyes. The hairstyle is to allow the hat to be worn properly. Boys – Boys' hair is to be conservatively cut, worn clear of the eyes, and off the collar. It is to be a natural colour . Tails, braiding and extreme haircuts (e.g. tracks) are not permitted . Hair is not to be tied up.
Undergarments - Underwear, Singlets, T-shirts, Shorts	Underclothing worn beneath the College uniform must be of a neutral colour and must not be visible .
Jewellery	Jewellery is not to be worn with the College uniform or at official school functions and events. The only exception: girls may wear one pair of small, round ball, (silver or gold only) stud earrings. Jewellery is not to be worn on free dress days except permitted studs.
Make-up	Makeup is not to be worn by Primary students. Female secondary students may wear makeup if it is natural and discreet. Nail polish is to be clear.
Standard of Dress for 'Free Dress' Days	General principles: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Common sense and modesty is important when choosing your clothes for 'Free Dress' days, making appropriate consideration for sun protection (it is recommended that students wear a hat). • Clothing needs to be of 'smart' appearance and in good condition. • Footwear should be shoes and socks (joggers, sneakers, runners or similar). Slip on shoes are not permitted. • Secondary student may wear sandals with a strap across the back of the foot to distinguish them from slip on shoes, but must wear closed in shoes for practical classes. • Secondary students must wear sport uniform for sport classes on 'Free Dress' days. • Jewellery is not to be worn during 'Free Dress' days except for girls regulation small, round ball, (silver or gold only) stud earrings. Boys: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • T-shirts or casual buttoned shirts for boys, no singlets. Girls: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dresses and blouses for girls should cover the shoulders completely or have thick straps (at least 6cm wide). No strapless or thin-strapped attire permitted. • Girls may not wear mini shorts, miniskirts or mini dresses. • Make-up should be discreet and nail polish clear.
Safety Equipment	Students must wear safety equipment as required by the College when in specialist classrooms. This includes but is not restricted to safety eyewear, aprons, safety gloves and dust jackets for workshops and labs; mouth guards, shin guards, helmets, face-masks (as required in sports such as softball).
Year 12 Senior Jersey	Year 12 students may wear their Senior Jersey with the College sport uniform only.
